#### Experience

2006–Current Office of State Fire Marshal, Deputy State Fire Marshal

- Management of a district made up of 5 counties, including Jefferson, Crook, Deschutes, Grant and Wheeler. I am also assigned to the Warm Springs Indian Reservation as the Liaison between them and the OSFM.
- A large part of my job is to either assist with or lead fire investigations for all types of fires in my assigned district.
- Training both the fire service and the public in all aspects of fire investigation.
- Act as a consultant to City and County Development Officials, Law Enforcement Officers, other Fire Code Officials and Fire Chiefs on fire law and fire investigations.

2004-2006 Bend Fire & Rescue, Fire Inspector/Investigator

- Worked under the Deputy Chief/Fire Marshal managing an area within the fire district.
- Similar position to what I do now but just on a smaller scale.

2001-Current Warm Springs Fire & Safety, Firefighter/EMT

- During my time as a full-time employee at Warm Springs Fire, I became a shift Captain and was also placed in charge of all fire investigations that occurred, whether I was on shift or off.
- This was when I first started to attend formal training with IAAI, the National Fire Academy and others.

1994-Current Jefferson County Fire District #1, Captain/Duty Officer

- Started as a Firefighter trainee in 1994.
- Promoted to Lieutenant in 2002 & started assisting the Fire Marshal with investigations and other fire prevention duties. Then to Captain in 2003.
